The CSAANYS Coaching program is designed to provide an opportunity for our teachers to grow professionally from a coaching relationship.

1:1 Coaching

Mentor Coaching pairs 1:1 trained **CSAANYS** Coach with a This model teacher. offers confidential and individualized support. The coach and teacher form a partnership, working collaboratively toward the achievement of mutually defined goals to develop the teacher's skills, abilities, and thinking. For 2020 a virtual platform will be used for meetings and contact is available to teacher needed the as between meetings.

Group Coaching

This model features the benefit of the support of colleagues in addition to that of the coach. By and challenges with sharing successes colleagues and a coach, teachers build capacity by identifying strengths and delving into concrete day-to-day situations. 2 or more teachers (up to 6) either from the same school or different schools in a region form a Coaching Circle with the coach acting as facilitator. Circles form for the school year and feature four individual 1:1 sessions with the coach as well as six 60-minute group sessions. Support is available as needed between meetings.

CSAANYS Coaching differs from teacher partner mentoring. Both kinds of coaching have value, but they are different and support the teacher in very different ways. CSAANYS coaches are not school employees, therefore there is a high level of comfort with the confidentiality and objectivity that comes with an external coach. Teacher partners, who are colleagues, can offer a lot of insider history and knowledge of routines, procedures, and school culture. CSAANYS coaches, however, are trained to focus on overall professional growth by advancing a teacher's ability to think through challenges and strengthen his or her skills using impactful questioning, active listening, and reflection.
